





CALDWELL FIRE STATION 1 AND 4 BUILD TIMELINE AND UPDATES

May 7, 2024: Workshop to discuss proposed locations for Station 1. *Click here to watch*.

Nov. 7, 2023: Over 4,300 votes were cast, with 2,904 (66.74%) in favor and 1,447 (33.26%) against. Idaho bonds require 66.67% to pass. A recount confirmed the bond's approval at 66.74%.

Sept. 5, 2023: The Caldwell mayor and city council approved a bond ordinance to rebuild and expand fire stations, allowing the bond to proceed to the ballot.

Aug. 15, 2023: A survey educated the community on fire station statuses and services, gathering input on priorities and a potential bond to construct two new stations. With 527 responses, 74% supported the bond.
